The winner will also receive the new traveling Skye K. Richendrier Memorial Trophy.

Skye Richendrfer (1957-2022) began piping as a boy in Bellingham, WA. He led the Macalester College Pipe Band (1977-1980), cofounded the Minnesota Piobaireachd Society (1979), and competed successfully in the Pacific Northwest solo piping circuit and with the word-champion Simon Fraser University Pipe Band (1980s). He founded and led the world-renowned Celtic Arts Foundation in Mt. Vernon, WA (1990s-Nov. 2022), where pipers from around the U.S. and Canada, including the Midwest, met and worked with "the





greats". Skye took lessons from several piping legends, including Donald MacLeod and, in recent years, Murray Henderson. Skye's warmth, self-effacing humor, generosity, organizational skills, eagerness to foster developing pipers, passion for piping and all things Celtic, and countless contributions to piping in Minnesota and beyond inspired the creation of this trophy, as a way to memorialize Skye and to recognize and encourage developing piobaireachd players.

Our Guest Adjudicator – Andrew Douglas

Andrew Douglas is a prolific practitioner of the bagpipe, having been active at the highest level of pipe bands, solo competition, teaching, and creative endeavors for the past 20 years. He's also the founder and creator of Dojo U and of PipersDojo.com. His accolades include 2017 & 2019 World Championships with Inveraray and District Pipe Band, Winner of USA Silver Medal for Piobaireachd, Former Pipe Major of the Grade 1 Oran Mor Pipe Band, Multi-prize winner, Silver Medals at Oban and Inverness, and Former Winner of B-Grade Strathspey/Reel at Oban (2004). He is an Accredited Bagpipe Teacher and Examiner with the Scottish Qualifications Authority and an EUSPBA Adjudicator.
